Thursday, August 1st, 2024:

You had an ability to inspire people to thirst for more from you, whether it was a tale from your own life or any other character & event you chose to describe.

Your life was intertwined with many personalities who shaped the history of Europe. You were orphaned at a young age, losing your father our Uncle Christo and one year later your mother Francoise. After the passing of Uncle Philip Duke of Edinburgh, you were the last remaining grandson of King George I of Greece, and the last great-grandchild of Christian IX of Denmark. Through your mother Francoise d'Orleans, you were a descendant of the royal house of France.

Uncle Michel when you were out and about you were unmistakably aristocratic but yet always remained modest and unassuming, like most of us Greeks.

You loved tradition in your own Avon guard way, while strict and demanding of others, but still very calm and sweet to us all.

Uncle Michel your unique and multifaceted personality grew from a full and creative life lived in New York, Paris, Patmos & Athens, drawing energy from your love for others and from the love others bestowed upon you.

I felt that Love was as a source of energy for you and your work, coupled with the thirst for knowledge and balanced with optimism that formed your philosophy and the way you lived your life.

You are adored not only by the wonderful family you created with Marina, your daughters Alexandra & Olga, who with Nicholas & Aimone also have provided you with wonderful grandchildren. Beyond the family you are adored by the countless people who came to know you through the years personally and through your writings.

But it was not until you met your beloved Marina, that your life was complete, as you often said, "Marina is the anchor that connected me to the country I so cherished." Greece has for ever remained deep in your heart and became your final home.

Your absence will leave a void that can't be filled, but your remarkable personality and lasting contributions will continue to inspire and guide us. While your writings will leave behind a rich tapestry of memories and contributions.
